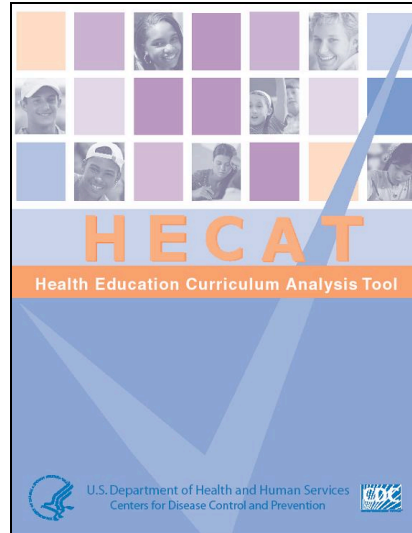


# Health Education Curriculum Analysis Tool (HECAT) Workshop

**What is the HECAT?** The *Health Education Curriculum Analysis Tool*, or HECAT, is an assessment tool developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). This tool will assist you in conducting a clear, complete, and consistent analysis of health education curricula based on the National Health Education Standards and CDC's Characteristics of Effective Health Education Curricula. HECAT results can help school districts select or develop appropriate and effective health education curricula, enhance existing curricula, and improve the delivery of health education.
